




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Indonesia, the age 65+ population will increase 128% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 16%. For comparison, Indonesia's age 65+ growth rate ranks #49 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #6 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia.



What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 654 per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Indonesia compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Indonesia is 8.9. This means there are 8.9 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Indonesia ranks #122 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #7 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia, in terms of pressure on working



In 2015, the median age in Indonesia was 28.4. The country ranks #102 out of 201 nations and territories in the world and #6 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia.


