


Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In French Polynesia, the age 65+ population will increase 148% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 10%. For comparison, French Polynesia's age 65+ growth rate ranks #28 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #1 out of 3 in Polynesia.



What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does French Polynesia compare?

The old age dependency ratio in French Polynesia is 12.2. This means there are 12.2 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, French Polynesia ranks #91 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 3 in Polynesia, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



In 2015, the median age in French Polynesia was 31.5. The country ranks #75 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #1 out of 3 in Polynesia.


