




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Uzbekistan, the age 65+ population will increase 129% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 15%. For comparison, Uzbekistan's age 65+ growth rate ranks #46 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #4 out of 5 in Central Asia.




