# Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Greece, the age 65+ population will increase 24% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will shrink 5%. For comparison, Greece's age 65+ growth rate ranks #190 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #10 out of 12 in Southern Europe.



#### What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

#### How does Greece compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Greece is 36.1. This means there are 36.1 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Greece ranks #3 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #2 out of 1: in Southern Europe, in terms of pressure on working



In 2015, the median age in Greece was 43.6. The country ranks #6 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #3 out of 12 in Southern Europe.


